

TITLE: GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES ON PHARMACEUTICAL PATENTS AND IPR

RESOURCE PERSON: DR. D. GIRI from DKW College

Date: 17-09-2021

On September 15, 2021, Narayana Pharmacy College hosted a seminar titled "Global Perspectives on Pharmaceutical Patents and IPR," presented by Dr. D. GIRI, an expert in the field of intellectual property rights (IPR) with extensive knowledge of pharmaceutical patents.

The seminar commenced with an introduction to the fundamental concepts of IPR, emphasizing its significance in the pharmaceutical industry. Dr. D. GIRI explained how patents serve as a crucial tool for protecting innovations and encouraging research and development. On 10/03/2022, Narayana Pharmacy College hosted an insightful and impactful session titled "The Future of Pharmaceutical R&D: Challenges and Opportunities," led by the esteemed S. Pawan Kumar. controls in a dairy farm.

On the 15 of Feb, 2022, the second-year B.Pharmacy students embarked on an educational visit

to the Vijaya Milk Dairy. The primary objective of this visit was to gain firsthand knowledge of

the pasteurization process and the associated temperature controls that are crucial in dairy

production. This visit was not only an opportunity to observe theoretical concepts in a practical

setting but also to understand the importance of these processes in ensuring the safety and quality

of milk products.

Introduction to Vijaya Milk Dairy

Vijaya Milk Dairy is a well-known dairy farm that specializes in the production of various milk

products. It is renowned for its stringent quality control measures and advanced processing

techniques. The dairy follows meticulous procedures to ensure that the milk and milk products

are safe for consumption and meet high-quality standards.

Pasteurization Process

The students were introduced to the pasteurization process, which is a critical step in milk

processing. Pasteurization involves heating the milk to a specific temperature for a set period to

kill harmful bacteria without affecting the nutritional value and taste of the milk.

- Receiving and Testing Milk: The raw milk is first received from the farms and tested for quality and contaminants. Only milk that passes these tests is allowed to proceed to the pasteurization process.
- Preheating: The milk is preheated to a lower temperature before pasteurization to remove any air and to prepare it for the next step.
- 3. Pasteurization: The preheated milk is then heated to a temperature of at least 72°C (161°F) for 15 seconds in a high-temperature short time (HTST) pasteurizer. This temperature and time combination is effective in destroying harmful pathogens like Salmonella, E. coli, and Listeria.
- 4. **Cooling:** After pasteurization, the milk is rapidly cooled to a temperature of 4°C (39°F) to prevent the growth of any remaining microorganisms.
- Storage: The pasteurized milk is then stored in sanitized tanks before being packaged for distribution.

Temperature Level Controls

Temperature control is a critical aspect of the pasteurization process and overall milk processing. The students learned about the various stages where temperature control is essential:

- Receiving and Storage: The raw milk is stored at a low temperature to prevent spoilage
 and bacterial growth before it is processed.
- Preheating: Controlled preheating ensures that the milk reaches the required temperature for effective pasteurization without denaturing the proteins.
- Pasteurization: Precise control of the pasteurization temperature is crucial. The
 equipment used is calibrated regularly to maintain the correct temperature and time
 settings.
- Cooling: Rapid cooling is necessary to prevent the growth of thermophilic bacteria and to maintain the quality of the milk.

• Storage and Distribution: The final product is stored at 4°C or below and transported in refrigerated vehicles to ensure it remains safe for consumption.

The students also understood the role of technology and automation in ensuring consistent quality and safety in dairy production.

It provided them with a comprehensive understanding of the pasteurization process and the critical role of temperature control in dairy processing. The seminar concluded with an interactive session, where attendees had the opportunity to ask questions and engage in discussions with Mr. Kumar. This session




