#### **COURSES**

#### **B.Pharm**

The Bachelor of Pharmacy (B.Pharm) program at Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Anantapur (JNTUA) is a four-year undergraduate course that provides comprehensive training in pharmaceutical sciences. Accredited by the Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) and the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), the program blends theoretical knowledge with practical experience, equipping students for careers in the pharmaceutical industry, healthcare, research, and academia. The curriculum covers key subjects such as Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Pharmacology, Pharmaceutics, Pharmacy Practice and Pharmacognosy, along with emerging areas like Pharmaceutical Biotechnology. Students benefit from state-of-the-art laboratories, experienced faculty, and hands-on industrial training. The program also emphasizes research opportunities, encouraging students to engage in innovative projects that contribute to advancements in drug development and healthcare solutions. Graduates of the B.Pharm program can pursue roles in drug formulation, quality control, hospital pharmacy, regulatory affairs, and research and development. They are also well-prepared for higher studies in specialized fields of pharmacy. With strong industry connections and an emphasis on holistic education, JNTUA's B.Pharm program is an excellent choice for aspiring pharmacy professionals.

#### **Eligibility**

Bachelor Degree in Pharmacy requires a candidate to have cleared 10+2 with Physics, Chemistry, Maths (PCM) or Physics, Chemistry, Biology (PCB) or Physics, Chemistry, Maths & Biology as subjects. One must also pass with at least 50% marks in Pre University Course with biology/mathematics as one of the subjects, or complete a D.Pharma. (Diploma in Pharmacy).

There is an option of pursuing Direct Second Year Bachelor of Pharmacy (Lateral Entry) if one has: Should have aggregate of 50% marks in the First and Second year D. Pharmacy Examination with a pass in HSC or equivalent with Physics, Chemistry and Biology (Botany & Zoology) or Mathematics.

Minimum qualifying marks in 10+2 examination as per Regulation (1a) above with pass in two-year D. Pharmacy course.

The criteria of minimum percentage of marks may differ from institute to institute. In some states it is also mandatory to give an additional pharmacy entrance examination in order to be eligible for the course.

#### Pharm D

The Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) program at Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Anantapur (JNTUA) is a 6-year professional degree designed to train students in advanced clinical and community pharmacy. It includes five years of academic study followed by a one-year internship or residency in a hospital setting. The curriculum covers a range of subjects including Pharmaceutics, Pharmacology, Clinical Pharmacy, Pharmacotherapeutics, and Hospital Pharmacy, with an emphasis on patient care and therapeutic drug monitoring. Students also gain knowledge in clinical research, biopharmaceutics, and pharmacy practice, aligning with the standards set by the Pharmacy Council of India (PCI). Throughout the course, students undergo regular evaluations through exams, practical assessments, and project work. The final year is focused on hands-on training, where students participate in hospital ward rounds, interact with healthcare teams, and provide medication counseling. This practical exposure helps students apply their academic knowledge to real-world clinical settings. Upon completion, graduates are equipped for roles in clinical and hospital pharmacy, pharmacovigilance, regulatory affairs, and research, or they may choose to pursue further studies.

#### **Eligibility**

- 10+2 examination with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects along with one of the following subjects: Mathematics or Biology.
- A pass in D.Pharm. course from an institution approved by the Pharmacy Council of India under section 12 of the Pharmacy Act.
- Any other qualification approved by the Pharmacy Council of India as equivalent to any of the above examinations.
- Provided that a student should complete the age of 17 years on or before 31st December of the year of admission to the course.
- Provided that there shall be reservation of seats for the students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes in accordance with the instructions issued by the Central Government/State Government/Union Territory Administration as the case may be from time to time.
- Pharma D, or Doctor of Pharmacy, is a professional degree focused on clinical pharmacy, patient care, and medication management. The program combines theoretical knowledge with practical experience in hospitals and community settings, preparing graduates to become licensed pharmacists, clinical researchers, or healthcare professionals specialized in optimizing patient outcomes through effective medication use.

#### M.Pharmacy

The Master of Pharmacy (M.Pharm) program at JNTU Ananthapur typically covers advanced topics in pharmaceutical sciences and is designed to provide specialized knowledge in various fields of pharmacy. The M.Pharm course is generally of 2 years duration, divided into 4 semesters. our college offers specializations like Pharmaceutics & Pharmaceutical Analysis. Eligibility Criteria Candidates must have a Bachelor of Pharmacy (B.Pharm) degree with a minimum percentage as specified by the university. Admission is typically based on entrance exams like GPAT (Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test) or PGECET. The Core Subjects have Advanced topics in pharmaceutical sciences, drug design, and drug delivery systems. The Practical Training includes laboratory work, industry visits, and internships. Students are required to undertake a significant research project, which is usually carried out in the final year.

#### **Eligibility**

- Candidates who have passed Bachelor of Pharmacy Programme with not less than 50% of marks, of any recognised University or any other Institute equivalent thereto the University, are eligible for admission to the Master of Pharmacy Programmes.
  - For SC/ST candidates, the eligibility is a pass in the B.Pharm. degree Programme.
- An entrance examination Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT) and interview is also conducted for admission. GPAT is an all India Examination to be conducted by the Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda, Vadodara on behalf of All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi.
- The Scores in Graduate Aptitude Test for Engineering (GATE) were in use till the year 2009 for admission in Masters Programme in Pharmacy (M.Pharm) and also for awarding fellowships/scholarships to Pharmacy graduates along with engineering graduates.
- The Organizing Committee for GATE expressed its inability to include Pharmacy graduates in GATE with effect from the year 2010, owing to operational problems due to large number of candidates appearing for GATE examination. Therefore, in order to facilitate admission of Pharmacy graduates in M.Pharm. as also to award fellowships/scholarships to Pharmacy graduates, AICTE decided to organize and conduct an examination in the name of Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test (GPAT) with effect from academic year 2010-11. Accordingly, a National Monitoring Committee (NMC) was constituted for monitoring the issues pertaining to the policy as well as conduct of GPAT examination.
- M.Pharmacy, or Master of Pharmacy, is a postgraduate program that delves into advanced studies and research in pharmaceutical sciences. The program prepares graduates for careers in research, academia, clinical practice, and the pharmaceutical industry, emphasizing drug development and patient care.




#### **Department of Pharmaceutical Analysis**

along with 300 e-books. DELNET facilitates resource sharing among libraries through its network. N-LIST provides e-resources to students, researchers and faculty. Shodhganga and Shodhsindhu allow access to Indian thesis and dissertations. Additionally, the M-Library app on Google Play offers access to KNIMBUS's database from JNTUA, providing students and faculty with a wide range of books and journals for enhanced academic research and study.

#### **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

#### **B.PHARMACY**

The admission procedure for the B.Pharmacy course follows a structured process based on state-level entrance exams and counseling. To be eligible, candidates must have completed 10+2 with Physics and Chemistry, along with either Mathematics or Biology (PCM or PCB stream), from a recognized board. A minimum aggregate of around 45–50% is required, though this may be slightly relaxed for reserved categories. The primary mode of admission is through the AP EAMCET/ EAPCET (Andhra Pradesh Engineering, Agriculture, and Pharmacy Common Entrance Test), specifically under the Pharmacy/Agriculture stream. The exam is usually conducted in mid-May, and students must apply for and participate in the APSCHE counseling process, where seat allotment is done based on EAPCET rank, category, and preferences. The college offers around 100 regular government-category seats and an additional 30% under the management or NRI quota. Once a seat is allotted, students are required to report to the college with all necessary documents, which include the EAPCET admit card and rank card, 10th and 12th mark sheets and certificates, domicile certificate (if applicable), caste or reservation certificates, transfer or migration certificate, ID proof (like Aadhar), passport-size photos, and the downloaded admission form.

#### **PHARMD**

The admission procedure for the Pharm.D (Doctor of Pharmacy) follows a structured process based on eligibility, entrance exams, and centralized counseling. Pharm.D is a six-year professional program that includes five years of academic study followed by one year of mandatory internship or residency in a hospital. The college offers approximately 30 seats, of which 70% are filled through government quota (Convener seats via AP EAPCET counseling)\*\* and the remaining 30% through the Management/NRI quota.

To be eligible, candidates must have passed 10+2 or equivalent with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects and either Mathematics or Biology as the third subject. A minimum aggregate of 45% is required (40% for reserved categories), and candidates must be at least 17 years old as of December 31st in the year of admission. Admission is primarily based on performance in the EAMCET/ AP EAPCET (Engineering, Agriculture & Pharmacy Common Entrance Test). Students must qualify in this exam to be considered for

government quota seats. For management and NRI quota seats, selection criteria may include AP EAPCET rank or performance in the 10+2 examination, depending on the college's discretion. After qualifying, candidates must participate in APSCHE counseling, where seat allotment is carried out based on rank, category, and seat availability.

The general admission timeline starts with the AP EAPCET application process in March–April, followed by the exam in May, and counseling in June–July. Selected candidates must report to the college for document verification and fee payment during July–August. Required documents include the AP EAPCET hall ticket and rank card, SSC and intermediate certificates, D.Pharm transcripts (if applicable), caste or reservation certificates, domicile/local status certificate, transfer/migration certificate, recent passport-size photos, ID proof like Aadhar, and a medical fitness certificate if requested.

#### **M.PHARMACY**

The admission process for the M.Pharmacy (Master of Pharmacy) program is a well-defined and merit-based procedure. The program spans two years and is offered in specializations such as Pharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Analysis, with an annual intake of approximately 15 seats per specialization. To be eligible, applicants must possess a B.Pharm degree from a PCI-recognized institution with at least 50% aggregate marks (45% for reserved categories). Admission is primarily based on performance in either the GPAT (Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test) or the AP PGECET, with 70% of seats allotted through the AP state convener counselling (based on entrance test ranks) and 30% through management/NRI quota. Required documents include B.Pharm mark sheets and degree certificates, GPAT/PGECET score card, SSC and intermediate certificates, caste/domicile/reservation certificates (if applicable), migration certificate, transfer certificate, and recent passport-size photographs.

Subject: Fee Refund Policy 2024-25

आदरणीय महोदया/महोदय.

The University Grants Commission receives many representations/complaints from students/parents on the non-refund of fees by the Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) on cancellation/withdrawal of admissions.

- Students should be allowed a full refund of fees within a specified period to enable them
  to opt for a course of their choice.
- The Commission has considered the matter in its 580<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 15 May 2024, and after considering the relevant factors decided, the following fee refund policy for the academic session 2024-25:
  - a. Notwithstanding anything contained in any guidelines/ prospectus/ notification/ schedule, a full refund of fees shall be made by the HEIs on account of all cancellations of admissions/migrations of students up to 30 September 2024 and with a deduction of not more than Rs. 1,000, as a processing fee, up to 31 October 2024.
  - b. It shall apply to all higher education institutions, whether established or incorporated by or under a Central Act or a State Act, and every institution recognized by the University Grants Commission under clause (f) of Section 2 of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 and to all institutions deemed to be a University declared as such under Section 3 therein and to all higher education institutions affiliated to a University.
  - c. These guidelines would also be applicable to organizations, consortiums, committees, associations, etc., constituted for the purpose of conducting counselling or processing admissions and collecting fees on behalf of participating HEIs, and the HEI concerned will be responsible for refund fees.
  - d. For any admission schedule extending/commencing beyond/after 31 October 2024, the provisions contained in the UGC Natification issued in October 2018 on Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates shall apply (reproduced below for ready information).

- e. This policy will remain in force for subsequent academic sessions until the issuance of a revised policy by the UGC.
- 4. It may also be noted that the UGC has notified the Redressal of Grievances of Students Regulations, 2023, wherein "delay in, or denial of, the refund of fees due to a student who withdraws admission within the time mentioned in the prospectus, subject to guidelines, if any, issued by the Commission, from time to time" has been defined as one of the grievances.
- 5. The Higher Education Institutions are requested to ensure compliance with the fee refund policy for the academic session 2024-25 and redress any grievance by the provisions of the University Grants Commission (Redressal of Grievances of Students) Regulations, 2023.
- Any HEI violating the provisions of UGC Fee Refund Policy 2024-25 shall be liable for punitive action as notified in Clause 5 of the UGC Notification on Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates issued in October 2018.

### **RIGHT TO INFORMATION**

The Right To Information Act 2005 was passed by the Parliament on 15th June 2005. The Act mandates that organizations defined as "Public Authorities" are obliged to provide information to the public and create necessary arrangements in order to promote transparency and accountability in the working of every public authority. Narayana Pharmacy College has been declared as a "Public Authority" under the Act. Information Implementation of the Right Act 2005. to

Right to Information Act, 2005 (22 of 2005) has been enacted by the Parliament and has come into force from 15 June, 2005. This Act provides for right to information for citizens to secure access to information under the control of public authorities. In pursuance of the Right to Information Act 2005, an officer has been designated as Public Information Officer (PIO) and he shall perform the duties and responsibilities as envisaged under the act without fail. Necessary steps for implementation of various provisions including proactive disclosure of certain kind of information. Such information shall be made available to the public at large through the website. The addresses of our office and organization structure are available on the website.



### **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

### **B.PHARMACY**

The admission procedure for the B.Pharmacy course follows a structured process based on state-level entrance exams and counseling. To be eligible, candidates must have completed 10+2 with Physics and Chemistry, along with either Mathematics or Biology (PCM or PCB stream), from a recognized board. A minimum aggregate of around 45–50% is required, though this may be slightly relaxed for reserved categories. The primary mode of admission is through the AP EAMCET/ EAPCET (Andhra Pradesh Engineering, Agriculture, and Pharmacy Common Entrance Test), specifically under the Pharmacy/Agriculture stream. The exam is usually conducted in mid-May, and students must apply for and participate in the APSCHE counseling process, where seat allotment is done based on EAPCET rank, category, and preferences. The college offers around 100 regular government-category seats and an additional 30% under the management or NRI quota. Once a seat is allotted, students are required to report to the college with all necessary documents, which include the EAPCET admit card and rank card, 10th and 12th mark sheets and certificates, domicile certificate (if applicable), caste or reservation certificates, transfer or migration certificate, ID proof (like Aadhar), passport-size photos, and the downloaded admission form

### **PHARMD**

The admission procedure for the Pharm.D (Doctor of Pharmacy) follows a structured process based on eligibility, entrance exams, and centralized counseling. Pharm.D is a six-year professional program that includes five years of academic study followed by one year of mandatory internship or residency in a hospital. The college offers approximately 30 seats, of which 70% are filled through government quota (Convener seats via AP EAPCET counseling)\*\* and the remaining 30% through the Management/NRI quota.

To be eligible, candidates must have passed 10+2 or equivalent with Physics and Chemistry as compulsory subjects and either Mathematics or Biology as the third subject. A minimum aggregate of 45% is required (40% for reserved categories), and candidates must be at least 17 years old as of December 31st in the year

of admission. Admission is primarily based on performance in the EAMCET/ AP EAPCET (Engineering, Agriculture & Pharmacy Common Entrance Test). Students must qualify in this exam to be considered for government quota seats. For management and NRI quota seats, selection criteria may include AP EAPCET rank or performance in the 10+2 examination, depending on the college's discretion. After qualifying, candidates must participate in APSCHE counseling, where seat allotment is carried out based on rank, category, and seat availability.

The general admission timeline starts with the AP EAPCET application process in March–April, followed by the exam in May, and counseling in June–July. Selected candidates must report to the college for document verification and fee payment during July–August. Required documents include the AP EAPCET hall ticket and rank card, SSC and intermediate certificates, D.Pharm transcripts (if applicable), caste or reservation certificates, domicile/local status certificate, transfer/migration certificate, recent passport-size photos, ID proof like Aadhar, and a medical fitness certificate if requested.

### **M.PHARMACY**

The admission process for the M.Pharmacy (Master of Pharmacy) program is a well-defined and merit-based procedure. The program spans two years and is offered in specializations such as Pharmaceutics and Pharmaceutical Analysis, with an annual intake of approximately 15 seats per specialization. To be eligible, applicants must possess a B.Pharm degree from a PCI-recognized institution with at least 50% aggregate marks (45% for reserved categories). Admission is primarily based on performance in either the GPAT (Graduate Pharmacy Aptitude Test) or the AP PGECET, with 70% of seats allotted through the AP state convener counselling (based on entrance test ranks) and 30% through management/NRI quota. Required documents include B.Pharm mark sheets and degree certificates, GPAT/PGECET score card, SSC and intermediate certificates, caste/domicile/reservation certificates (if applicable), migration certificate, transfer certificate, and recent passport-size photographs.
